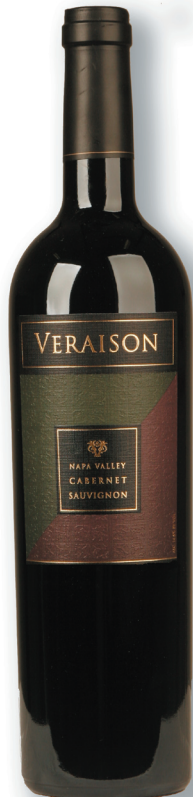


VERAISON

2004 Cabernet Sauvignon Stagecoach Vineyard

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| <i>Release Date</i> | September 1, 2007 |
| <i>Vineyards</i> | Stagecoach Vineyard, Block- L1, T4, D4, E1, A4 & D6 South and Southwest facing vineyard blocks on the South side of Pritchard Hill, 1,550 feet above sea level. The soils in the three main blocks of L1, T4 and D4 are shallow, red and rocky, forcing the vines to struggle which results in intensely flavored wine. |
| <i>Vintage 2004</i> | A winter with plentiful rainfall was followed by a warm spring resulting in an early bud break. A warm and occasionally hot summer continued to speed vine growth. Fall heat spells required patience and water to achieve optimal hang time, complex flavors, as well as the ripeness and power found in great vintages. |
| <i>pH/Brix</i> | 3.81/27.2 |
| <i>Harvest Dates</i> | September 25 - October 8, 2004 |
| <i>Fermentation</i> | All select parcels of fruit were fermented as individual batches. Each parcel underwent a 3-4 day cold soak before fermentation was allowed to start with indigenous yeast, each batch spent an average of 28 days on skins and completed malolactic fermentation in barrel. |
| <i>Varietal Composition</i> | 78% Cabernet Sauvignon, 9% Merlot, 6% Petit Verdot, 4% Cabernet Franc, 3% Malbec |
| <i>Alcohol</i> | 14.8% |
| <i>Cooperage</i> | Matured for 19 months in 85% new French oak barriques - Taransaud & Bossuet |
| <i>Bottled</i> | May 5, 2006 Unfined & Unfiltered |
| <i>Production</i> | 1752 cases |



WINEMAKER'S COMMENTS

Deep red/crimson with black hues; the 2004 "Stagecoach Vineyard" Cabernet Sauvignon exemplifies Cabernet and displays layers of complexity. Aromas of blackberries, dark cherries and plums are interspersed with notes of dark chocolate, mocha, currants and sage. The palate is full bodied and rich. It delivers the same ripe fruit flavors on the palate; blueberries, raspberries, blackcurrant and dark cherry, all the time retaining a beautiful savory nature, cedar and cigar box. The mouthfeel is finely knit, with firm fine tannins which lead to a long finish. Serve with glazed rack of lamb or steak Delmonico. Enjoy now through 2019.
