

Vineyards	Stagecoach Vineyard approaches the Oakville appellation at its westernmost slopes. Climbing up the southern extent of the Pritchard Hill appellation, the vines ascend to almost 1800 feet. Black Bart's Bride originates in three separate blocks from our easternmost vineyards, up to one of our few north facing slopes, and into the heart of Stagecoach ranging in elevation from 1400 to 1800 feet up.
Vintage 2005	The 2005 vintage started off slowly. However, plenty of sun-filled days and warm temperatures well into late fall allowed for incredible maturity of flavors. Our 2005's are indicating early on that they have the potential to be the most impressive wines in our long history of family winemaking.
